What is Code Camp?

Code Camp is a non-profit event all about software development, by and for the developer community. Code Camp started in the eastern United States in 2004 and has spread to numerous cities around the globe. Last year over 5000 developers participated in Code Camps in the western US alone. Many developers make a weekend out of travelling to a Code Camp in their region. The consistently high quality and wide range of content makes it a popular training event for developers, rivaling events that cost thousands of dollars to attend.

Community Driven

Code Camp is made up of technical presentations submitted by the local developers, and is organized by local developers as well. All are encouraged to participate and speak on development topics that interest them. Particular effort is made to create a friendly atmosphere for first-time presenters, encouraging more developers to share their expertise and be recognized by their peers.

All about the Code

Code Camp emphasizes less slides, more code. The main requirement around code demonstrated is it must be shareable with education-friendly terms. Code Camps typically have an eclectic mix of sessions ranging from introductory to advanced, from broad in scope to esoteric and left field. Attendees have their pick of subjects ranging from software design and methodology, web development, multimedia graphics and gaming, application security, interface design, robotics, and much more.

Inclusive

Code Camp strives to be available to anyone interested. They are held on the weekends outside of office hours so anyone can participate. Code Camp is free to attend thanks to the contributions of supporting organizations.

Code Camp is an all-ages event with something to offer developers of all levels, from beginner to advance. It's a great opportunity for prospective students to learn about the field from industry veterans in their local area.

Platform agnostic

Code Camp is unique in that it isn't specific to a particular platform, technology, or language – if it has something to do with code, it is fair game.

About Desert Code Camp

Desert Code Camp was launched in 2004 with attendance and speaker participation increasing every year. It is one of the largest community-run events in the local tech community, with attendance over 700 estimated for April 2013. Desert Code Camps have taken place all over the Phoenix Metro area; this one will take place in Chandler, AZ at the Chandler-Gilbert Community College. We've seen between 30 to 100 sessions during the course of a single event, and expect to see greater levels of participation this time around.
